- d) Observation of lesson (Teaching skill-class control, classroom interactions, motivation, examples and illustrations, questioning, dealing with the problematic students etc.)

b) **Observation of teaching-** observe the teaching with respect to following points class control, classroom interactions, motivation, examples and illustrations, questioning, reinforcement, dealing with the problematic students etc.


