

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In India it is also known as the 10th Board exams. It is public examination conducted by various boards of education including ICSE, CBSE, and state boards for students of senior classes, etc. Boards are conducted under the state government different states are conducting exams at state levels.

The Central Board of Secondary Education also called as (CBSE) is a national level boards of education in India for public and private schools controlled and managed by union government of India. CBSE has asked all schools affiliated to follow only NCERT curriculum. There are approximately 20,299 schools in India and 220 schools in 28 foreign countries affiliated to the CBSE. Formation of CBSE Board is also on 3 November 1962. Their Headquarters are in New Delhi, India. They conduct official language Hindi and English, parent organisation Ministry of Human Resource Development.

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NATURE AND STRUCTURE OF THE CURRICULA OF DIFFERENT BOARDS.

Nature and Structure of SSC Board.

Secondary School certificate commonly known as 'SSC' OR state Board virtually every state of India has its own Board Education department at the end of class X and XII. The education structure paper and exam patterns may vary from state to state . This is comfortable for parents who would be staying in the same state during their child's education at least till class X since the syllabus may vary between states. It is not flexible to compare the Results of two different state boards . The syllabus may not be up to the central standards. The students are generally well acquired with the education system of the state.

- **Focusses on Strength and Capacities**

focusing on child's strength gifts and interest will be an important part of trying to plan for the day to day inclusion of your child in regular classrooms and other school activities .

- **Personalized learning plans (PLP)**

This programmes include a plan with he which has specific objectives and recommendation for services and support to help meet the needs of your child. A PLP will vary depending on the circumstances on each child.

using this PLP as a basis for inclusion and a quality education .

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- * To clearly identify what you want your child to learn during the school year. ie. fairly consistent with the goal that you have already set for your child.
- * To identify ways in which your child can be included in the activities of the classroom as well as other school activities.
- * To identify the kind of support your child will need to learn and to participate and how that support will be provided.
- * To identify other children who can be role model for your child so he or she can learn social skills or develop good language skills.

Suggestions for parents attending PLP meetings.

- Expect to be full and equal partner in planning process.
- Have an outline of what you want to get out of the meeting.
- keep in mind the strengths and need of your child.
